

Harper Library & Resale Shop

"The Little Library That Could" became the "Little Library That Did"

The seed for what would grow into today's Harper Library was planted by Gayle Reed in a letter to the editor of the Fredericksburg newspaper in April 2004. She pointed out the need for a library in the western part of Gillespie County. It was at least a fifty-mile round trip to check out a book!

The dream started to become a reality when Peggy Ernst called the first meeting of interested citizens in June 2004. The small group of workers set off to collect book donations and secure a location for the new library. They rented a small house on US Hwy 290 and began to fur-

nish it. Officers were elected to the newly formed Friends of Harper Library: Peggy Ernst, President; Gayle Reed, VP; Tomi Pugh, Secretary/Treasurer. Jeannie Ross, a retired librarian from Kerr helped the group set up the library and trained the volunteers in cataloging, processing, and ordering of books. The first Summer Reading Program for children was held in 2005. One original helper, Sharon Kasper, worked to present the program. For many years since then, she has Co-chaired the event with her sister, Brenda Hollis. The volunteers organized book sales; held Music Fests, silent auctions, and sponsored Home Tours to raise funds for the new library. The Harper Library was soon recognized as a 501 © 3 corporation. The Library Dedication and Open House was held on Sunday, April 2, 2006.

"No more room" was the call heard just one year later. The library moved to a larger location on Hwy 290. It had better parking, room to house the library's collection and a public meeting room. A Grant from LCRA enabled the purchase of a circulation desk and other furnishings. Saturday Seminars and a "Books on Wheels" program were started. "Super Saturday" was held in the park. Used books were sold, cakes and pies were auctioned, and a dinner was cooked. Grant money provided standardized shelving, an automated Biblionix program, and computers.

On May 17, 2008 the Library Corporation opened the Resale Shop in a building on Hwy 290, formerly the Sinclair Service Station. The shop's first management team was Glenda Rusin, Kathryn Jenschke, and Kathleen Keller. Thanks to the Peterson Foundation and local department stores the shop was equipped with clothing racks and hangers. All proceeds from sales at the Resale Shop benefited the library.

In January 2009, the library signed a contract with Gillespie County. The contract was needed to join the Texas Library System which would provide access to borrowing books throughout the State and the availability of workshops and training. New activities at the library included Preschool

Story Hour, Senior Game Day, a Fireworks Jamboree in July, Santa visits in December, a Youth Volunteer Club, and an Adult Literacy Program and ESL (started by Marcia Greding and continued by Emilio Rendon and Kerry Sandstrom).

"No More Rent" was the new call heard. In October 2009, the Sanders Farm & Ranch building was purchased. Renovations were completed in the Spring of 2011. With private donations, numerous grants, and sales from the Resale Shop, the renovation costs were paid in full.

Tomi Pugh was appointed the volunteer Library Director. Donating thousands of hours of her time and her expertise to manage the library, Tomi served until 2017 when a paid part-time Director was hired. Part-time Directors have included Cindy Barkley (2017-2020) and Laura Foster (2020-23). The new Director, Denise Mozingo, was welcomed on March 20, 2023.

Today the library has a collection of over 13,000 items including adult fiction and non-fiction, children, juvenile, and young adult sections, Texas history, biographies, westerns, large print books, audio books, DVD's, books in Spanish, reference books, and periodicals. There are seven computer stations of which two are designated for children. Library services include interlibrary loans and a digital library through Libby. Office services include faxes and copies. The Community Room is used by game day groups, for community meetings, and for presentations by informative speakers.

Special thanks to Robert & Doris Kensing, sustaining donors, and all individual current and future donors for their generous donations to make possible the preservation and growth of our small-town Library and Resale Shop well into the future.


