Both of our staffs have seasoned volunteers and now there are opportunities to volunteer at both the library and the resale shop.

Harper Library volunteers can be assigned to a regular weekly shift. Regular shifts are usually 4-5 hours. "Floater" volunteers are called in to work whenever the usual volunteer cannot be present. We welcome volunteers who can only give time every week or 1-2 days a month or who want to help plan and assist in our programs offered to the public. The library director or a seasoned volunteer will happily train you. We try very hard to always have 2 or more volunteers assigned to each shift.

The HVFD has been providing fire response services since 1940 and EMS coverage since 1946, covering 505 square miles in Gillespie County with an all-volunteer team. The hardworking, dedicated members are "representatives from all walks of life including business professionals, educators, city employees, ranch-



ers, wives, husbands, parents, students, and retired workers" (HVFD Volunteer Brochure). Since many of the volunteers work full time, there is a great need for individuals who are available during the daytime hours. Also, young men and women are encouraged to join the ranks and learn from the current experienced volunteers. HVFD and EMS need more than the current number of volunteers to respond to the needs of the community.

The minimum requirements to join include: "a strong desire to serve our community, ability to work as part of a team, be 18 years or older, have an acceptable driving history and current Texas driver's license, and pass a criminal background check. To apply an individual must meet with an officer and obtain an application, submit a completed application, and attend a business meeting" (Brochure).

Volunteers can expect in house training, training with other departments, and other professional training to obtain both Fire and EMS credentials. "Volunteering looks different for everyone! Whether you are on the end of a nozzle inside a burning building, extricating occupants of a crashed vehicle, setting up a landing zone for a helicopter, providing medical treatments to a sick person, providing support to other fire fighters on a scene, preparing a fire apparatus for the next call, or helping our community to prepare for emergencies - all are critical to the service of our community" (Brochure).

The HVFD is visible in the community in so many other ways. The ambulance is stationed at local 4th of July firework displays, rodeos, and HISD football games. They participate in send-offs for high school play-off games and band competitions. The HVFD participates in activities for Fire Prevention Week and assists with the Shattered Dreams event. They also host the HISD Kindergarten class for a visit each school year.

CENTRAL TEXAS ELECTRIC COOPERATIVE SCHOLARSHIP

CTEC awards twenty-five \$1,000 college scholarships to students whose primary residence is served by CTEC. Students must attend an accredited Texas institution of higher education and enroll for a minimum of 12 credit hours or be considered by the registrar to be a full-time student. Students must be of good character as evidenced by at least two letters of recommendation from teachers, principals, counselors, etc. at the student's current school. Applicants must have a coherent degree plan and must demonstrate willingness to pursue a course of higher learning. Applications and guidelines are available in early January to schools in co-op service territory or on the CTEC website. Guidelines and information will be in the January issue of the CTEC magazine. Recipients will be announced in late April or early May. Applications are due by February 23, 2024.
