



Annual Harper WMA Youth Hunt



The Harper Wildlife Management Association Youth Hunt is planned for January 15-17, 2021. The hunt, open to veterans' children ages 9-17, has approximately 18 youth registered this year. The event is co-sponsored by HWMA, Fredericksburg Salutes Our Wounded Warriors (FSOWW), and the Texas Youth Hunting Program (TYHP). Scholarships are provided by FSOWW for many of the children and their sponsors. During the weekend, in addition to harvesting a deer, youth participate in educational activities related to hunting safety, wildlife conservation, and land management.

The event gives veterans the opportunity, as their slogan states, to spend "quality time in a deer blind and a lot more" with their teenage children. This is the 8th year for the hunt held in memory of Jacob Krebs, who drowned in 2013 while training for his Navy SEALS contract. Jacob always looked up to those who served our country, thanked every veteran he met, and believed in honoring every wounded warrior. The hunt serves as an indirect way to give back to

them in memory of Jacob.

The Harper community has been directly involved in the event every year. The hunt is successful because of local donors, landowners who open their ranches for hunting, and the many local volunteers who assist in every aspect of the hunt.
